### **Shop Talk**

As we moved into the early season of trail maintenance our equipment, for the most part, held up well with only minor issues. Our focus is and will continue to be on preventing problems versus dealing with unexpected and expensive emergency repairs but we still have to be able to respond quickly if an issue arises.

As far as detailed issues are concerned, we had plenty of shop projects going on in the past few months. The BR180 had an unexpected fuel system issue that we discovered as we were preparing the machine for winter. This required us to hire some outside expertise to get everything resolved. We have had a few issues with the Polaris Ranger side-by-side, primarily related to the track system. The new Argo has functioned as it should with no real issues. I'm told it indeed does float but is a rough ride on frozen ground. All grooming equipment is ready to roll for the most part and look forward to seeing more snow so we can put things to work. With some good volunteer help, we did some reorganizing of the cold storage area to accommodate the expanded gambling storage room.

Once again, thanks to all who assist and support our efforts to maintain our ever-expanding fleet of equipment. We truly are privileged to have such a nice and well-equipped facility to support our trail maintenance efforts.
