

Applicant Requirements -

• Compose minimum 2-page Essay (doubled-spaced and typed) from following topic: "What would you do to educate and stop riders of all ages and experience levels from trespassing and to stay on the trails?"

- Must be a good standing MnUSA member for past 3 years (if under 18 years or still in high school this will include membership as a son, daughter or legal ward of a family having current)
- Have passed the Minnesota Snowmobile Safety Course and have a Snowmobile Safety Certificate
- Complete application (preferred typed) with Student Activity Profile
- 2 Letters of Recommendation (relating your involvement with one about snowmobiling/club and one school/community)
- Include your name on all submitted pages
- Include a shoulder/head shot photo (can be your senior class photo)
- Submit to office and Committee Chairperson by mail or email no later than 3/31/25

# Minnesota DNR shares reminders about the snowmobile riding season

As snowmobile riders prepare for the upcoming riding season, the Minnesota Department of Natural Resources reminds riders of important dates, safety tips and registration requirements.

While the snowmobile riding season can start as early as Dec. 1, as yet this year there are no locations in the state with suitable conditions for trail grooming. Several conditions must be met before trails are open, groomed and ready for travel:

- The ground must be frozen. Where trails cross wetlands, 15 inches of ice are needed to support the weight of trail groomers.
- Adequate snow cover of about 12 inches must be on the ground to allow for trail packing and grooming.
- Trails must be cleared of fallen trees, signs put in place and gates opened.

While snowmobilers await the arrival of more snow and groomed trails, now is a good time to make sure registrations are current and snowmobiles are in

good operating order, review safety training, and check local trail maps for route changes or new trails.

Registrations for new snowmobiles must be purchased in person at a deputy registrar of motor vehicles or at the DNR License Bureau in St. Paul. Renewals of registrations and state trail passes for snowmobiles not registered in the state of MN can be handled in person at these same locations or on the **DNR's licenses and vehicle registrations website** (mndnr.gov/licenses).

The DNR shares information about snow depth and state-managed trail conditions on its <u>DNR snow depth and groomed trail conditions</u> <u>webpage</u> (mndnr.gov/snow\_depth). Local trail conditions are often posted online by tourism associations, chambers of commerce and volunteer snowmobile clubs. To find the nearest club, visit the <u>Minnesota United</u> <u>Snowmobiler's Association website</u> (mnsnowmobiler.org).

Important snowmobile riding safety tips include:

- Be weather aware and don't ride in adverse weather conditions.
- Check the trail conditions and weather forecast for the destination before leaving home.
- Measure ice depth before riding on lakes and rivers. The DNR recommends a minimum of 5 to 7 inches of new, clear ice for snowmobiles.
- Always stay on designated snowmobile trails. Venturing off trails can result in accidents, loss of trails from landowners, and trespass violations.
- Don't drink alcohol and ride. Alcohol is a factor in more than 60% of fatal accidents in Minnesota.
- Always wear a quality DOT-approved helmet and facemask.



If your club does not currently have a member who is the designated Ride Command trail manager, here are some details about the program.

How to put Ride Command to work for your club and its business sponsors

Ride Command, the leading mobile app and website for trail riders, has the power to provide snowmobile clubs and associations with greater visibility, trail mapping with real-time accuracy, and the ability to help your club raise funds in the process.

Ride Command has partnered with hundreds of clubs and associations across the Snow Belt, helping them:

- Manage their designated trail system on the Ride Command map, right on their computer. Add, update, reroute or temporarily close trail segments for real-time accuracy.
- Prevent illegal, off-trail riding on private property by showing all legal routes. Add waypoints with photos for trailheads, parking, scenic spots and more.
- Use the new Community feature to publicize club rides and events,

Working with our Ride Command team of life-long riders and mapping / GIS professionals, your snowmobile club is able to:

- Create Premium Points-of-Interest for their business sponsors that sell food, fuel and lodging on the Ride Command website and free mobile app — so visiting riders have all the information they need to plan rides and find rider services while out on the trail.
- Include those POIs as part of their business membership or sell the "digital ads" on an annual basis.

Suggested price for each premium marker can vary and is entirely up to the club based on the business's trail location, rider traffic and price charged for ads on their printed map. Clubs collect 100% of the proceeds. Polaris receives no funds from this program.

- 2. Complete and submit a Ride Command club application. It will be reviewed by the Ride Command team, and a welcome letter will be sent to them, complete with details on how to get started maintaining trails, creating waypoints and POIs, and more, right on their computer.
- Your club's trail manager will receive our Ride Command trail manager newsletter, with news and updates to share with your club.

#### Minnesota Snowmobile Club Donates to Birchwood Four Corners EMS

The Sno Barons snowmobile club, based in North Branch, Minnesota and best known for their annual Haydays grass drags held in September every year that is acknowledged as the largest



snowmobile related event in the world recently donated \$1500 to the Birchwood Four Corners EMS in their effort to raise funds for their UTV rescue vehicle. The money will go towards the purchase of tracks that can be used during the winter months to make the UTV more efficient in getting around when snow is on the ground. The tracks cost approximately \$27,000. The Sno Barons were asked to make the donation by Steve Bethke, current president of the Birchwood Bobcat Riders and a member of the Sno Barons club for 41 years.

According to Bethke, the Sno Barons dedicate a portion of the money they make each year at Haydays to support other clubs in Minnesota and Wisconsin with issues involving snowmobiling. "Having been an active member of the Sno Barons when I lived in Minnesota I was aware of the club's commitment to helping other clubs. With snowmobilers most likely to benefit from the ability of the rescue vehicle to reach them on the trails it seemed like a good match", said Bethke.

At their December 14th monthly meeting the Bobcat Riders matched the Sno Barons with a \$1500 donation of their own for a total of \$3000 going to the Birchwood Four Corners EMS.







#### Good Time Riders host landowners' event

The Good Time Riders Snowmobile club is in the southeastern area of the state (Mower County) bordering Iowa.

With the lack of snow in this area, we have had to find other things to do such as UTV rides and hotdog roasts and a pizza party.
